

FIRST BC RESIDENTIAL CARE EXPERIENCE SURVEY

Seniors Advocate Isobel Mackenzie announced in May the launch of a province wide survey of 27,000 residents living in 303 publicly-subsidized care facilities in BC. The survey is intended for every resident and their most frequent visitor and will ask a number of questions about their quality of life in the care facility. The survey will explore a range of questions on privacy, food, safety and security, comfort, respect and responsiveness of staff, personal relationships, medications and activities in the facility. Residents will be interviewed in-person and their most frequent visitor, who is usually a family member, will be sent a mail-out survey.

The survey will be rolled out in successive phases. Phase one will start with government operated sites, starting in July. The next phase, anticipated for late August/September will include privately operated sites. A date has not been scheduled for Langley Lodge yet, however we do expect one month's notice. There will be posters in our building four weeks prior to the survey commencing here.
